Waste and Recycling

As was reported at the AGM our costs for waste removal are astronomical. Please, if possible, take your yard waste to the Town yard located behind Wild's Lumber store, your large items not suitable for the Riverside waste receptacles to the County transfer station on Range Road 51, and your recyclables to the Town Recycle Location on 6 St. SE or home to your own recycle bins. After checking with the Town, as requested at the AGM, they are unable to supply recycle containers to the park and we are currently investigating other options.
